This week...

We have started our topic on measures in maths. We've been looking at different units of measurements and thinking about the most appropriate unit to measure in. Additionally, we've been using rulers to measure in centimeters and drawing lines of different lengths, which has been a little tricky!

In reading, we have continued our class reader Charlotte's Web, exploring how the author has used dialogue to show characters reactions and feelings effectively. The relationships between the characters in the story are really developing and we can see how close Wilbur and Charlotte are becoming.

In our wider curriculum lessons, we have looked more at farming during ancient Egyptian times. We discussed the farmers calendar and the different seasons. We then looked at how the River Nile was important in farming and daily Egyptian life - linking beautifully to our DT work on the shaduf which we brought to life this week too. We used detailed sketches to create models of a working shaduf using pully's and levers to ensure that our shaduf can lift and move small objects much like how it was used in Ancient Egyptian times.

We cannot forget our amazing day yesterday. We went to the National Coal Mining Museum to experience life as a miner during the Victoria era. It was a great reminder of all we learnt during our last topic. Although it was great to walk in a Victorian chid miners' shoes for just a while, we decided that being down the mine for 10 hours a day, 6 days a week was not for us! We had a brilliant day though and thoroughly enjoyed coming home looking dirty with soot.

We've had a busy half term and we hope you have a restful break and make the most of the lovely weather (fingers crossed).

In maths, we've started our new topic on area, diligently counting squares and comparing the areas of different shapes.


Reading saw us continue with Krindlekrax, where we focused on how suspense was created, and we also learned some fascinating facts about Steve Irwin and his love for crocodiles.

In art, we have been looking at the many different grades of pencil and investigated which one we felt gave the best tone and intensity. We have used this knowledge to create accurate line drawings of London Bridge. The children have been very proud of their fantastic artwork and have been desperate to share it on dojo.

This week...


Year 6 have had a busy week. In writing we have looked at both Oliver Twist and The Lighthouse. We have produced some beautiful pieces of extended writing.
